



Thinking Big at Forest School

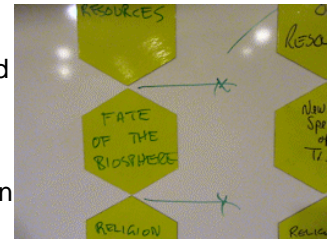
